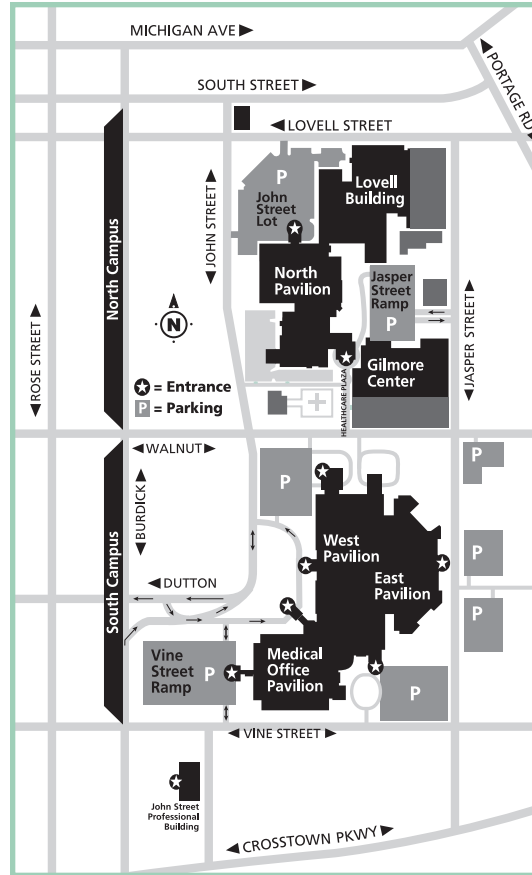

# Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course

The Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course (ENPC) is a two-day program designed to upgrade the knowledge and skills necessary to care for pediatric patients in emergency situations. This is a nationally recognized program which has been highly recommended for nurses who care for children. It is asked that if ENPC focuses on the initial care of the pediatric patient, would this course benefit nurses who do not work in an emergency department. The answer is yes, if you care for children, regardless of the setting, you may be called upon to deliver emergency care.

Therefore, the target audience includes:

- Nurses practicing in an emergency department setting
- Critical care nurses
- Nurses caring for children in an out patient setting
- School nurses
- Nurses on general pediatric units
- Nurses participating in the transport of critically ill children

In addition, LPNs, EMT-Ps, and PAs may audit this course.

The course has been developed by a group of nationally recognized experts in pediatric emergency care. It includes the following lecture topics and psychomotor skill stations.

Prior reading of the lectures is strongly recommended, paying particular attention to Initial Assessment Chapter 4 and the Skill Stations.
