Directions

From the South (US 131)

At Exit #36A, turn east onto Stadium Drive, drive 2.2 miles to Howard Street. Turn left and go 0.6 miles; turn right onto West Michigan Avenue. Follow the roundabout to the second turn, which is Rankin and exit. Go to the stop sign and turn right onto Business Court then left into the large parking lot, then immediately right into the Fetzer Center parking area, Lot #72F.

From the North (US 131)

At Exit #36A, turn east onto Stadium Drive, drive 2.2 miles to Howard Street. Turn left and go 0.6 miles; turn right onto West Michigan Avenue. Follow the roundabout to the second turn, which is Rankin and exit. Go to the stop sign and turn right onto Business Court then left into the large parking lot, then immediately right into the Fetzer Center parking area, Lot #72F.

From I-94 Detroit (East) and Chicago (West)

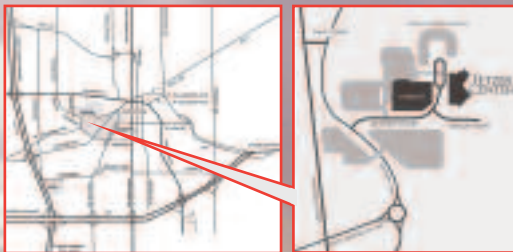
From I-94 merge onto US 131 north and continue Northbound. At Exit 36A, turn east onto Stadium Drive and continue for 2.2 miles. Turn left onto Howard Street and continue for .06 miles. Turn right onto West Michigan Avenue. Follow the roundabout to the second turn, which is Rankin, and exit. Go to the stop sign, then turn right onto Business Court then left into the large parking lot, then immediately right into the Fetzer Center parking area, Lot #72F.

From M-43 West of Kalamazoo

Drive easterly past US 131 and after 1.9 miles, turn right onto Solon Avenue and drive south 0.5 miles where Solon turns into Howard Street. At the light, turn left onto West Michigan Avenue. Follow the roundabout to the second turn, which is Rankin and exit. Go to the stop sign and turn right onto Business Court then left into the large parking lot, then immediately right into the Fetzer Center parking area, Lot #72F.

Parking

The Fetzer Center parking lot, Lot 72F, is directly adjacent to the Fetzer Center building. Upon entering the parking lot, each guest is greeted by our parking attendant and given a vehicle hang tag which provides them with complimentary parking for the day.
